In this Lenten retreat, we will contemplate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem recalled during the Palm Sunday Procession with Palms. "Fear not, O daughter of Zion! Your king approaches you on a donkey's colt" (Jn 12). What transpires next in the gospel is the mystery that contains and calls us to renounce ego and serve Jesus in the poor; that is, the mystery of Jesus' own descent into poverty, and his invitation to do likewise. Taking this journey with Jesus, we will consider how to evangelize today's world by being a church that is poor and for the poor.



Rev. Daniel J. Issing, C.S.C., is a priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross. He is an associate professor of theology at King's College in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, where he teaches courses in moral theology and social ethics. Fr. His current research, speaking engagements, and retreats focus on Pope Francis' call to pastoral ministry in a missionary key.
